## TERRELL COUNTY BOARD POLICY Early Educational Release Program

The Terrell County Board of Education believes that an early educational release program can provide students with experiences that will enable them to learn:

- 1. That knowledge gained in the classroom can be applied to on-going experience in the work-a-day world.
- 2. That basic life skills will be developed which will enable the student to make an advantageous entry into the world of work upon graduation.

## Definition

"Approved educational release program" shall mean those work-study programs sanctioned by the State Department of Education and the Terrell County Board of Education.

## Regulations

- 1. Parental consent in written form is required from parent/guardian of students involved in an early release program. This will be kept on file in the Principal's office.
- 2. All requests for early work release must be made to the principal or designee.
- 3. Students involved in early work release will not be required to maintain a specific grade average for participation.
- 4. The principal or designee must review and evaluate annually all requests for participation in the early release program.
- 5. Students leaving school early must go directly to work. Students violating this policy will lose their early release privilege.
